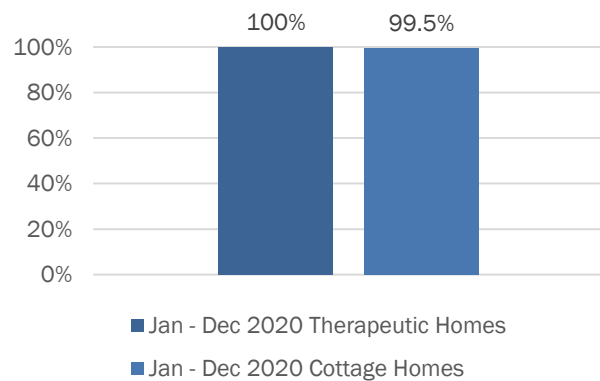
January - December 2020 Annual Report

Number of youth in care without a confirmed case of victimization by abuse, neglect, or exploitation by an agency caregiver.

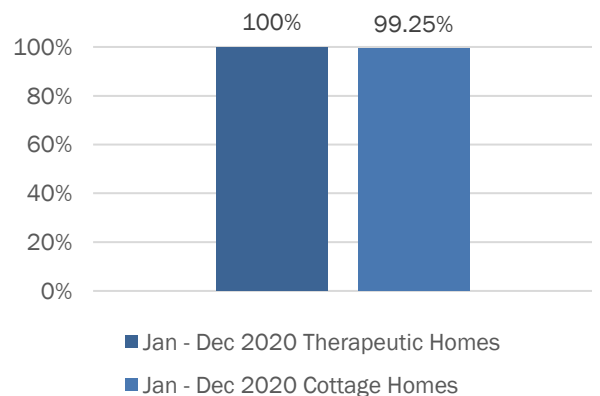
Youth are safe in care amongst agency caregivers

Number of youth in care without a confirmed case of victimization by abuse, neglect, or exploitation by a peer.

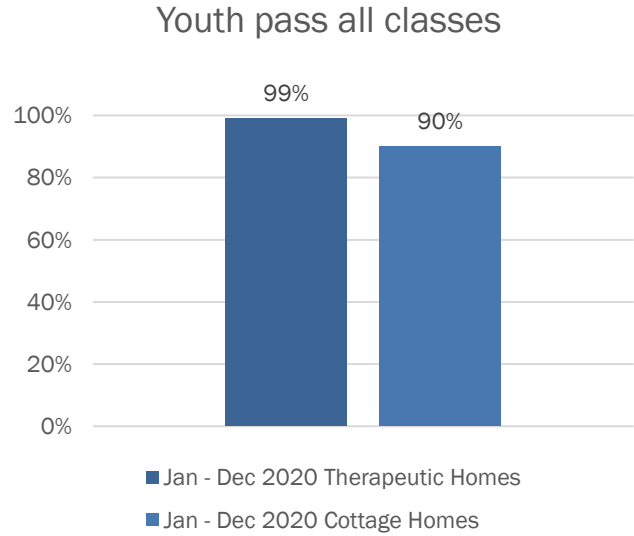
Youth are safe in care amongst peers





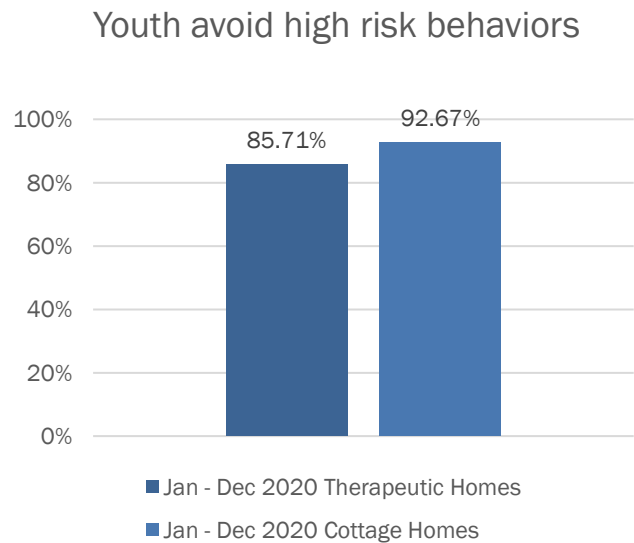
Youth pass all classes

Youth avoid high risk behaviors

Number of youth who have not been involved in a high-risk behavior. High risk behaviors are defined as: physical aggression, running away, substance abuse, self-harm, possession of illegal or prohibited substances, fire-setting, non-consensual sex, and the need for physical restraint.

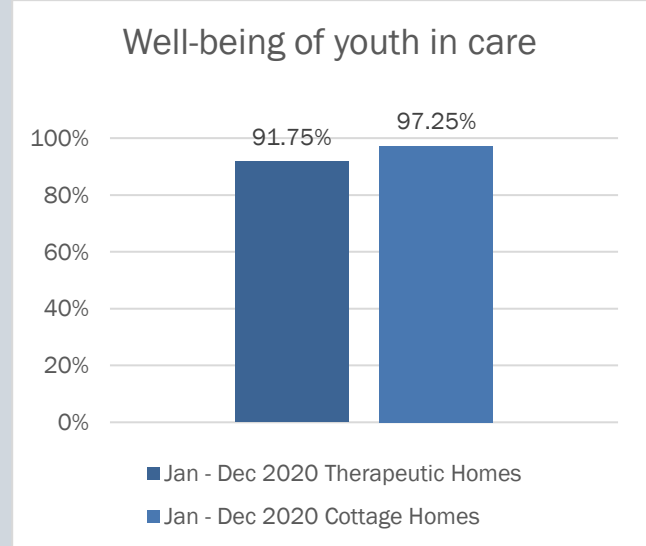




2020 Annual TCHC Outcomes Report

Well-being of youth in care

Number of youth in care that meet TDFPS minimum standard requirements for medical and dental exams.



In 2020, an average of 13.75 Cottage Home and 1.5 Therapeutic Home Agencies reported quarterly. An average of 620 youth were represented in quarterly reporting throughout the year.
